Fly tipping - advice sheet

Fly tipping is the illegal dumping of waste. Often, this will involve dumping large items that are dumped instead of being legally disposed of at a household waste and recycling centre or commercial site.

The difference between litter and fly tipping

Small items (example: Cigarette ends, food packets and drinks cans) that are improperly discarded will be classed as litter rather than fly tipping. As a guideline a single bag of rubbish will usually be considered fly tipping rather than litter.
