Albeit restrictions in relation to COVID-19 have eased, WRE SNT officers continue to ensure our communities remain safe and adhere to Government guidelines. We would like to thank our communities for remaining positive and enabling policing of the Warwick Rural East area with minimal issues.

Fly Tipping Nuisance

Unfortunately fly-tipping appears to be more prominent of late, with continual waste being dumped at certain locations. It is understandable there is some frustration due to local refuse centres having been closed and opening recently with restrictions but this does not excuse the illegal disposal of waste.



Fly-tipping increases costs to you and/or landowners for the correct removal/disposal of waste.

Although COVID-19 restrictions have eased slightly we are still not in a position to complete our dedicated school patrols at Radford Semele Primary School, however with some of the children returning following half term we can look to begin this again.

As the communities of Warwick Rural East Start to adjust to the easing of some restrictions with more people are out and about, we will continue with our ASB/Drug patrols and wildlife crime prevention patrols. Another of our priorities was speed checks along Sandy Lane, near to North Leamington School. I can share that week commencing 1st June we will look to commence these checks as well as some other locations around the Rural East patch. I cannot stress enough the importance of driving within speed limits as it keeps all road users safe.

I am very aware that although restrictions have eased slightly, it is still a challenging time for many. Please continue to do what you are doing to prevent any second spike with COVID-19. I can't thank you all enough for persevering through it all. Myself, Ed and Sharron continue to patrol villages that are part of our policing area. If you see us out and about please give us a wave, it always brightens our day.

Unfortunately there is no update on when our upcoming events will recommence, but as soon as we know you of course will be the first to know.

Although crime has reduced, which is super positive. Recent data from Action Fraud shows 1,713 victims have lost a combined total of £3,534,983 to coronavirus-related scams. RECENT EVENTS THAT HAVE TAKEN PLACE....



On the Tuesday 11th February our Community Forum took place.

Following a public vote the following priorities were set –

- 1) **Speed checks on Sandy Lane, Blackdown**
- 2) **Safety patrols at Radford Semele Primary School**
- 3) **Anti-Social Behaviour/drug prevention patrols**
- 4) **Wildlife Crime Prevention Patrols**

While we continue to give our focus to priorities we have had to reassign our activities to help police the emergency provisions enacted by Parliament and related to the Coronavirus Pandemic, specifically Social Distancing rules. This means we are undertaking numerous foot and vehicular patrols around the neighbourhood and assisting where called upon to do so. Within this we are still undertaking ASB/Drugs and Wildlife Crime Prevention patrols.



This month's CRIME PREVENTION advice...

Give Burglars nowhere to hide...

Burglars don't want to be seen or heard and if they think they'll be noticed by a neighbour or passer-by, they'll probably move on. Here's some advice on helping keep burglars out by giving them no places to hide.

You'd think that it would be best to make a property less visible from the street, and to keep it hidden from prying eyes behind overgrown bushes, trees, high fences or walls. In reality, all that this serves to do is make it easier for a burglar to get close to a home unnoticed, and provide somewhere to hide while carrying out a burglary or theft from the property.

1. Lower fences at the front around one-metre high are preferable to high fences as they allow for a clear view over the top and don't provide cover for anyone wishing to hide.
2. At the rear and sides, taller fencing is recommended to prevent easy access.
3. Trellis, thorny plants, or a suitable anti-climb topping such as plastic spikes make it difficult for anyone climbing over a fence or gate.
4. Planting prickly or barbed shrubbery along boundaries and fence lines acts as an effective natural barrier.
5. Gravel driveways and paths will make sure you hear anyone approach.
