Working in Partnership

Members of the Safer neighbourhood Team, as well as newly recruited police officers on attachment with the team worked alongside partner agencies focusing on Scap Metal Dealerships.



Local officers, alongside British Transport police, the Environment Agency and and Network Rail attended a number of scrap metal dealers in our force area. The aim of the visit was to conduct inspections and working with multiple agencies allowed us to carry this out



Overall this was a positive day and lots of interesting information was gathered.

Cannabis Farm Found After Warrant Executed

Using intelligence obtained from our local community, your local team executed a search warrant at an address in Fillongley.



Police officers and Police Community Support Officers executed a warrant in Fillongley and found a cannabis farm at the location. One male was arrested for production of cannabis and also possession of another class B drug.

The male admitted the offences and was given a police caution. Another great example of the community and the local policing team working together.

Stolen Motorhome Recovered and Suspects Arrested

Night shift officers patrolling from Coleshill Police Office were driving around Water Orton during the early hours and spotted this motor home that looked out of place.



As officers approached the vehicle, three people made off from them on foot. Enquiries with West Midlands police informed the attending officers that the motor home was in fact stolen and the owner didn't even know!

One happy owner was reunited with their prized possession....and the three who ran away?....all found and arrested. A good night shift and another good example of the work done by patrol officers who are based back in Coleshill.



Officers spotted a HGV swerving between lanes on the M6 as it passed through our area. The vehicle was stopped and the driver smelt of alcohol, there were several empty cans of lager and vodka bottles in the vehicle as well as an open can of lager in the cup-holder! The driver was arrested on suspicion of driving whilst unfit through alcohol and taken to Nuneaton custody.

Great work from the attending officers who could well have prevented an accident involving such a large vehicle.
